We help poor people to access basic services, including education, water and sanitation, as well as healthcare. We provide lasting routes out of poverty through our sustainable livelihoods schemes. Our integrated approach to development is transforming communities worldwide.

We take a rights based approach to development

and seek to tackle the root causes of poverty, ensuring the world's most vulnerable people have a strong voice and real influence in both our programmes and advocacy. Islamic perspectives on humanitarian and social justice issues inspire all aspects of our work.

Islamic Relief's vision and mission are inspired by our Islamic faith, and seek to exemplify Islamic values. We are guided by the values contained within the Qur'an and taught through the example of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), most specifically: ikhlas (sincerity), ihsan (excellence), rahma (compassion), adl (social justice) and amana (custodianship).
