Cross-sectoral and multi-stakeholder partnerships are playing a crucial role in achieving the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs. This event will highlight the positive impacts of partnerships with FBOs, and aims to enhance future partnerships in line with SDG 17.

In addition to SDG 17, this side event will focus on SDGs 1, 2, 3, 5 and 14, and outline actions being taken by faith-based organisations supporting the 2030 Agenda..

Through an interactive panel this event will ask:

- What milestones have FBOs achieved since the launch of the 2030 Agenda?
- How has the UN System developed partnerships with FBOs?
- What are the ongoing challenges for partnerships between FBOs and the UN around the SDGs?

This event will also provide concrete recommendations and commitments for enhanced engagement around the SDGs, looking forward to progress that can be reported in 2018.
