

UNICEF 6 point action agenda to put children at the center

- 1. Protect uprooted children from exploitation and violence.
- 2. End the detention of refugee and migrant children by creating practical alternatives.
- 3. Keep families together and give children legal status.
- 4. Help uprooted children to stay in school and stay healthy.
- Press for action on the causes that uproot children from their homes.
- 6. Combat xenophobia, discrimination and marginalization.

Areas of research on RFBO activity and contributions to refugees and forced migrants

- Prevention and preparedness
- Immediate Response (reception, protection, registration, physical psychosocial, trauma)
- Supporting communities (accommodation, education, health, employment)
- Durable solutions (return, resettlement, local integration)
- Sensitization and awareness raising (Host countries Combatting xenophobia)
- Policy/advocacy

Example of RFBO Refugee Response

Local Faith Actors: special roles (Forum on Localizing Humanitarian Response)

First responders – provision for universal needs; French Muslim Faith Community Nice food to informal camps on banks of River Roja

Transnational networks –Redeemed Christian Church of God, a Nigerian Pentecostal movement, assisting southsouth movement and integration

Refugees hosting refugees – overlapping displacement in Baddawi camp in Lebanon. Long term residents collect donations for iftar baskets for vulnerable families to break their fast during Ramadan

Shelter:

- South Sudan Catholic Cathedral in Wau 10K
 August 2017
- Syria Coptic Bishop Elias > 12 K families
- Mosque as safe space for children Rohingya
 Children in Bangladesh STC, WV and Plan
- Legal Aid St Andrew's Refugee StARS in Cairo legal aid for refugees
- Child protection in emergencies Uganda
 Bubukwanga Camp (child friendly spaces) WV

Advocacy: Pope Francis

Call to the world and especially Catholic communities to care for the displaced "Invisible voiceless children"

"....migrant children easily end up at the lowest levels of human degradation, where illegality and violence destroy the future of too many innocents, while the network of child abuse is difficult to break up,"

Appeal to host communities to work with refugees "for the good of their children"
